




#1 SOCIAL MEDIA INFLUENCERS

- Influencers are likely to have the skill to transmit messages through social media that have an impact on other peoples' ideas and practices.
- Influencers provide information and insights that are trusted and held in high regard. They attract reactions and comments of the crowd and find resonance with their audiences.
- Influencers are active on various platforms where they can spread ideas and have a large group of contacts that they can contact.
- Quantity vs quality: Influencers aren't always the most popular people on platforms in terms of numbers.

This is the era of evidence-based social media as more and more papers focusing on medicine and social media are coming out. An interesting paper was published a few days ago in the American Journal of Infection Control. Scanfeld et al. tried to reveal the rate of misunderstanding or misuse of antibiotics in Twitter messages in their study (Dissemination of health information through social networks: twitter and antibiotics.)

BACKGROUND: This study reviewed Twitter status updates mentioning "antibiotic(s)" to determine overarching categories and explore evidence of misunderstanding or misuse of antibiotics.

METHODS: One thousand Twitter status updates mentioning antibiotic(s) were randomly selected for content analysis and categorization. To explore cases of potential misunderstanding or misuse, these status updates were mined for co-occurrence of the following

We have run the shoot production for 25 years and have always been able to deliver perfect goods. In January 2011, we had sampled routinely on E. coli; the results were negative. In the second half of May, we tested on the basis of the current situation also different shoots. The laboratory results were also negative for E.coli (EHEC-free). Further steps depend on the analysis results from 06.06.






